Colonel John D. Kuenzli is an Army Logistics Officer from St. Johns, Michigan. In 1992, following his graduation from Michigan State University, Colonel Kuenzli was commissioned as an Active Duty Ordnance Lieutenant, branch detailed to Infantry Branch. He served as an Infantry Rifle Platoon Leader, Rifle Company Executive Officer, Aide-de-Camp, and Battalion Motor Officer.

In 1996, he attended the Combined Logistics Officer Advanced Course at Ft. Lee, and then served as a G4 Maintenance officer for 1st Armored Division, in Bad Kreuznach, Germany, and as a Company Commander in Hanau, Germany. He deployed to Bosnia, Israel, and Saudi Arabia during his tour in Germany from 1996 to 2000.

He later attended the Command and General Staff College at Fort Leavenworth, Kansas, and returned to Germany to join V Corps deployed in Iraq. He served on the Corps G-4 staff in various positions (G-4 Ops, G-4 Trans, and G-4 S&S), before becoming a Support Operations Officer and Battalion Executive Officer in 1st Armored Division, Baumholder, Germany. He deployed to Iraq twice during his tour to Germany. He finished his tour in Europe after serving as the Special Assistant to the USAREUR Commanding General.

Colonel Kuenzli then commanded the 10th Special Forces (Airborne) Group Support Battalion at Ft. Carson, Colorado, and deployed his battalion back to Iraq twice during his battalion command. Following Battalion Command, Colonel Kuenzli was assigned as the Company Grade Logistics Officer Branch Chief at the Army's Human Resources Command, and then as an Army War College Fellow at the NATO Defense College.

Colonel Kuenzli then commanded the 402nd Army Field Support Brigade (AMC) in Camp Arifjan, Kuwait. During his command he deployed to Afghanistan for 60 days and simultaneously commanded both the 401st and the 402nd Army Field Support Brigades.

Upon completion of Brigade Command, Colonel Kuenzli served as the Executive Officer to the AMC G3/4 at AMC Headquarters at Redstone Arsenal, and as the Director of the Commanding General's Initiatives Group.

He holds a Master's of Science from the Naval Postgraduate School, and a Bachelor's of Science from Michigan State University. His decorations include the Legion of Merit, the Bronze Star (w/ 2 OLC), the Meritorious Service Medal (w/ 2 OLC), the Joint Service Commendation Medal, the Army Commendation Medal (w/ 3 OLC), the Army Achievement Medal (w/ OLC), the Expert Infantryman's Badge, the Ranger Tab, and the Parachutist Badge.
