# Another Way to Get 'em Tight

**W**hat would you give, mechanics, to be able to tighten HMMWV alternator belts to specification as easily as turning a wrench?


You say it'd be worth a lot? Well, all you need is an alternator drive belt adjustment tool.

The tool holds the alternator and the belts in place after you've adjusted the tension. That leaves your hands free to tighten the alternator bolts.

But you can't buy one; you have to make it.

For the plans to make the tool and instructions on how to use it on 60-, 100-, 200- and 400-amp alternators, get a copy of TB 43-0001-62-8 (Jan 99). Pages 9-27 through 9-33 have the info.
